


# Regulatory institutions and practices inquiry evaluation survey








Organisation represented


The 'other' respondents were four representatives of industry bodies, one MP, one representative of a professional organisation (nurses), one union, one ITO, and two consulting firm.










When undertaking the inquiry the Commission engaged with the right people






## The inquiry went into sufficient depth on the issues it covered







How would you rate the inquiry report's findings and recommendations?




How would you rate the inquiry report's analysis of information?









